
Moreover, by them is your servant warned; in keeping them there is great reward.

of not having control over our lives. This is why we saw so many people buying so much toilet paper! No one knew why they were buying it. But in an article in Time magazine, a psychologist referred to this "toilet hoarding" phenomenon as a primal need. People were buying it, because having it makes us feel like we're in some sort of control, which brings us comfort.

But a time will come when things that happen to us will remind us that we are not in total control over our lives. There are things that we do not have any control over, and COVID-19 is a good example. In the bigger scope of things, we need something more certain and stable than just toilet paper or other basic human necessities.

We need something that will help us face our fears and not be overcome by them. We need something that will strengthen us to keep moving forward when we begin to feel tired or worn out. We need something that will keep our spirits grounded when the world around us seems to be falling apart. And the good news is, God gave us something that can never be thwarted or broken apart by the disasters that roam our world.
