Formed for GOD'S FAMILY

What comes to mind when you think of the word, "family"?

For many of us, the first thing that our mind goes to when we think "family" is our immediate family members. If we take some time to think further, however, we see that the meaning of that word reaches a lot further than those whom we are physically related to. For many of us, "family" includes close friends whom we feel comfortable sharing anything and everything with. For some others, it extends to certain groups that we are an active member of, such as a sports team, community band, social club, or church small group. At the core of it, it is our sense of **belonging** to a certain group of people that lead us to define who our "family" members are.

This innate sense of belonging that we, as human beings, seek shows that we are made to be in relationship with other people. Having been created in God's image (Genesis 1:27), we deeply long for genuine, deep-rooted relationships with whom we can share life (fellowship) with because God Himself is relational. Not only that, but we also desire relationships that are committed and long-lasting, because God is eternal. And the relationships that will satisfy these longings are the people with whom we share the faith in Jesus Christ. The church - God's family - is the family that will last forever. If this is the case, then is it not worth investing our time and efforts building meaningful, deep-rooted, long-lasting relationships with the people that we gather with at our local church?

As much as we realize the brokenness in ourselves and in our relationships with others, God lavishes His love upon us and invites us to become a part of His eternal household as His beloved children through Jesus Christ (1 John 3:1, Ephesians 1:5). In God's family, His own love for us will drive us to genuinely love each other as brothers and sisters - for eternity.
