THE GREATEST GIFT



This year's theme for our Grace Community Church comes from the passage, John 15:11

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete."

In John chapter 15, God compares our relationship with Him to a branch attached to a vine, for without the vine, the branch will wither away. We must remain in the Lord in order to experience His true joy and love. So, in order to abide in Him, how should we pray?
