FAMILY WORSHIP NIGHT

On Friday, June 12th, Pastor Kevin led the E-ministryfocused Family Worship Night. His sermon, titled "Unveiled," was based on 2 Corinthians 3:12-18. He shared that when we turn to things in the world for satisfaction, a veil is placed on our hearts which makes it hard for us to see God. The good news is, if we turn to the Lord, this veil can be removed. As the social distancing continues, it may become difficult for us to keep our eyes fixed on God, but we must stay grounded in our faith. Pastor Kevin also led us into a prayer time of for the upcoming summer events, that they may be overflowing with God's presence, even though they may be online.

SERMON NOTES



For the past four weeks, Pastor Park has been preaching on the Foundation Series. He has covered the topics of Creation, the Fall and Redemption so far. On Creation, despite the conflict with science among many Christians, Pastor Park talks about how the study of science and every scholarly endeavour is a study of God's created universe. Even Stephen Hawking once said, "It would be difficult to explain why the universe would have begun in just this way except as the act of God who intended to create beings like us." Learning more about God's creation leads us to worship Him, who is the Creator.

Expanding more on Creation, we also delve into what it means to be created in God's image. When we were created in His image, it meant that we were created to have fellowship with Him and to work as His counterparts. The more we communicate with God, the more we become like Christ, because God created us in His image and likeness.

Yet, we cannot forget that humanity has fallen.

"The substance of sin is humanity's attempt to stand at the centre of the world," Pastor Park preached. The intention behind Adam and Eve's sin was to become god of their own lives. When they hid themselves, God asked "Where are you?" Just as He asked this question to Adam and Eve, God often asks us where we are in our hearts. Is it with God, or do we attempt to stand at the center of our own life? May we always remember to place God at the center of our lives.

Wonderfully for us, though our image has been broken by sin, God has been unfolding His story of salvation. As God brought the Israelites out of Egypt, He has also brought us out of captivity to sin through His Son, Jesus. And as the Israelites were blessed as a holy nation to bless those around them, so we are redeemed and blessed to build God's kingdom, becoming His blessing to those around us. When we are saved, we are given the intrinsic desire to minister to those around us, starting from our families and ultimately to the ends of the earth.

Our identity in Grace Youth is "blessed to bless". This is fitting for this sermon series. Even in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, we are challenged to boldly reflect His light. Surely, having the Gospel perspective - for how we were created, to where we stand in this world, and where we are going- is incredibly powerful in our daily lives. Let us always remember that despite our sin, God continues to pursue us with His unfailing love so that we can be with Him for eternity. This is the foundation we were made to build our lives on, and praise God for making it possible for us in Jesus!
