"Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord.
He is like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit."

Jeremiah 17:7-8

The GEM Youth leaders spent a morning together at the leaders retreat meditating on Grace Youth's theme passage, Jeremiah 17:7-8. Leader Chris shares his reflection with us...

One habit I have developed over the years of reading different works is to pay close attention to the verbs that are present in what is written. Verbs are action words, and as readers, we naturally try to find the action words in any sentence to try and understand what it is saying.

Jeremiah 17:7-8 declares that the man who puts his trust in God is like a tree, planted by water. When we focus on the description of the tree in verse 8, what are the action words that are present? In particular, what actions are being **actively performed by the tree**, rather than being passively achieved?

The tree "not fear[ing]" and "not [being] anxious" have less to do with specific actions, but describe the emotions of the tree, so we can rule those out. Likewise, when the verse says that the tree's "leaves remain green" and "it does not cease to bear fruit," these are not necessarily actively performed actions. A tree's leaves being green, and its ability to bear fruit, are things that happen naturally when the tree has access to water, nutrients, and sunlight. They are, in a way, automatic.

The only action that the tree takes is to send out its roots by the stream.

I think as Christians, we spend so much time focusing on the wrong things. We might take great care to make sure that our leaves appear as green as possible to those around us, even to the point of wearing masks that don't represent who we really are. Or we might focus our energies entirely on bearing lots of fruit, committing everything we have to achieving something we consider meaningful at church, at school, in our relationships.

God reminded me through this passage that, first and foremost, we need to focus on sending our roots out to the water. Our first priority should be to reach for Him, to desire to drink from His fountain, to receive His grace and His mercy. When we do this, we will no longer fear the heat, because we know the water from His living fountain will keep our leaves green. We will no longer be anxious in the time of drought, because we know that **we will continue to bear fruit as long as we remain in Him** (John 15:5).

Let's shift our priorities back to what really matters.
