Looking at this message, another story in the Bible came to mind, one found in John 21:6-12. In this story, Jesus meets the disciples following His resurrection. When He meets them, Jesus is on the shore, while the disciples are on the water. When Jesus calls to them, however, they recognize Him and rush to meet Him. Simon Peter, notably, jumps into the water without hesitation and swims on ahead to Jesus. This was interesting to me because Peter was the same man who in Matthew 14:25-31 tried to walk to Jesus on the raging lake but sank due to his fear and lack of faith. In this transformation, or what you could call a leap of faith, I saw God really working in Peter, and I realised this applies to us as well.

A lot of the time, as Christians, we follow Jesus but struggle to really commit to serving Him and leading a righteous life. I, personally, allow my fears for the future and perfectionist attitude to make me lose sight of God and try to keep myself afloat in the midst of all my troubles and sin. Yet as I write this devotional, I realise that what I've been lacking is Christ. As Peter looked to Jesus and began swimming, as he took that leap of faith and aimed only for Christ, I too needed to let go of all my worries and just run to Christ. I needed to remember that "I have been crucified with Christ and. . . The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God" (Galatians 2:20). Not faith in my own abilities, but in God's. And so, Grace Youth, I pray that as we all head into this new month, that we will all be able to really let go of our fears and allow God to transform and work in us, calming the storm around us as we live by faith in Him.
